Most sexual assaults are carried out by someone known to the victim. This could be. partner, former partner, relative, friend or colleague.

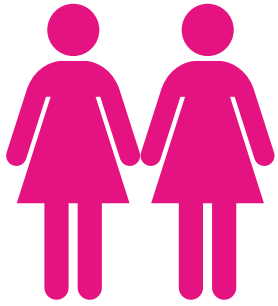


Did you know..?

It is not uncommon for the person being sexually assaulted to have no physical injuries or signs of their assault.

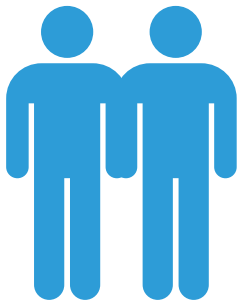


How many people are raped, sexually assaulted and sexually abused?



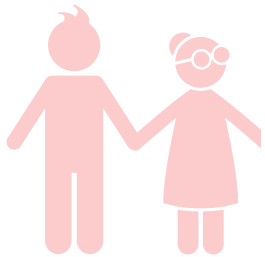
1 in 4 women

1 in 6 children

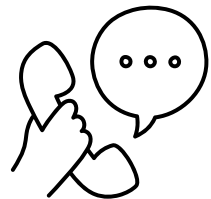
Have been sexually abused
